The Day of the Lord Will Come — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

1. What perspective on time does 2 Peter 3:8 offer?

That with the Lord, one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

2. How does 2 Peter 3:9 explain any apparent delay in God's promises?

God is not slack (slow), but is patient, not wanting anyone to perish, but for all to come to repentance.

3. How is the day of the Lord described in 2 Peter 3:10?

Coming as a thief in the night, unexpectedly.

4. Reflection: 2 Peter 3:9 reframes delay as patience rather than absence. Is there an area where you've mistaken God's patience for God's silence or inaction?
