Paul's Conversion & Mission — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

1. What was Saul doing before his encounter on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-2)?

He was breathing threats and seeking to arrest and persecute followers of Jesus.

2. What happened to Saul on the road, and how did it change him (Acts 9:3-9, 17-19)?

A light from heaven flashed around him, he heard Jesus speak to him and was struck blind for three days; after Ananias prayed for him, his sight was restored and he was filled with the Holy Spirit and baptised.

3. What happened to Paul and Silas in Philippi, and how did the jailer respond (Acts 16:22-34)?

They were beaten and imprisoned; after an earthquake opened the prison doors, the jailer, fearing the prisoners had escaped, was about to take his own life, but Paul stopped him — the jailer then believed and was baptised with his household.

4. Reflection: Saul went from persecuting Christians to becoming one of the greatest missionaries. What does his story teach us about God's ability to change a person's direction in life?
