Great Is Thy Faithfulness — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

## 1. What does the writer remember in Lamentations 3:19-20 that brings him low?

His affliction and misery, the wormwood and the gall — his soul is bowed down within him.

## 2. What does he recall in verse 21 that gives him hope?

'This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope.'

## 3. What is the famous statement about God's mercies in Lamentations 3:22-23?

'It is of the LORD's mercies that we are not consumed... they are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness.'

## 4. What does Lamentations 3:25-26 say about waiting on the Lord?

That the LORD is good to those who wait for Him and seek Him, and it is good to wait quietly for His salvation.

## 5. Reflection: This hopeful passage is surrounded on both sides by deep grief. What does that placement suggest about how hope and sorrow can coexist?
